

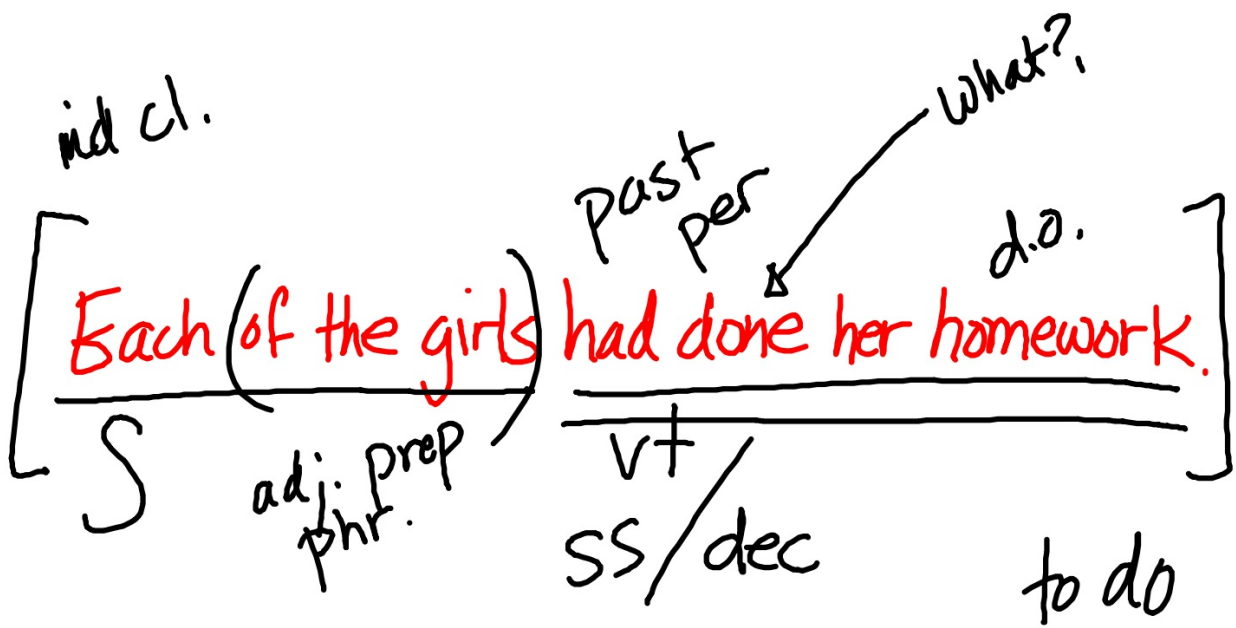

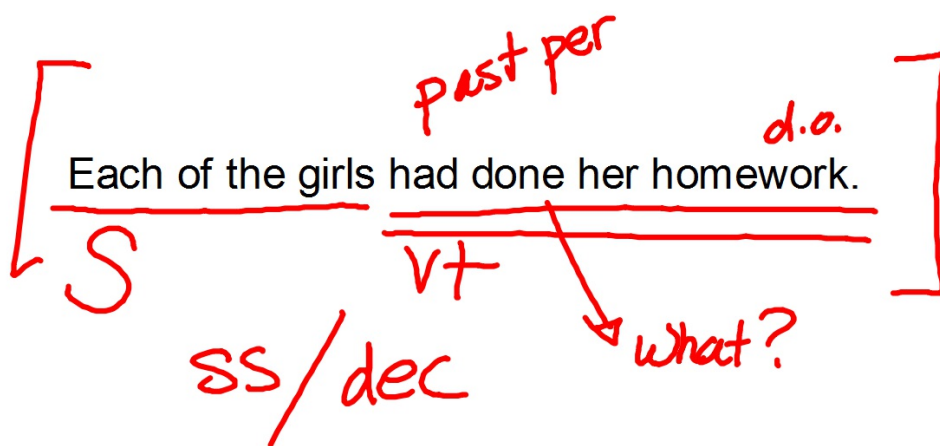

Most trouble with quote introductions.

Introduce these quotes – set up the scene:

Doodle was viewed as an outsider to his family from day one.

The narrator and family expressed their opinion of Doodle's looks when he was first born.

"He seemed all head, with a tiny body which was red and shriveled like an old man's."

— ill / weird / not normal

what does this quote show?
prove?

The narrator comments that "

Family judges D. based on looks alone

Most trouble with quote introductions.

Introduce these quotes – set up the scene:

From his birth, Doodle was delicate + fragile.

The narrator originally described Doodle upon seeing the newborn that

"He seemed all head, with a tiny body which was red and shriveled like an old man's."

red

The imagery of Doodle as small + red w/ an unnaturally large head helps accentuate the weakness of his body – and that his strength lay in his brain power.

symbolized
bigger brain / stronger
than body
(body weak)

What does the quote show/prove?
Doodle is delicate + fragile
he was different
odd

From the start of the story, Doodle's appearance makes him different than the rest of the family + it is clear he doesn't exactly fit in. The imagery used by the narrator in the description lead us to the thoughts that Doodle is sickly + not normal - he may not live.

Assertion

Brother continues his cruel treatment towards Doodle by forcing him into uncomfortable situations

Intro to quote

In the middle of the story, Brother talks about how he ^{forced} made Doodle to do things and how he

"~~One day~~ I took him up to the barn loft and showed him his casket, telling him how we all had believed he would die."

Explanation

By making Doodle touch the coffin, Brother bullies Doodle into touching the symbol of his own death. He makes Doodle face the fact that he has lived beyond what he "should have".

What does the quote prove?

Assertion

It becomes particularly clear that Brother loves Doodle with the closing scene of the story

~~At the very end of the story,~~ Brother's love towards Doodle came to light when he found Doodle's dead body in the brush and held him in the wake of the storm,

~~"For a long time, it seemed forever, I lay there crying, sheltering~~ [my] fallen scarlet ibis from the heresy of rain."

What does this quote prove?

From the start of the story, Doodle's appearance makes him different than the rest of the family + it is clear he doesn't exactly fit in. The imagery used by the narrator in the description lead us to the thoughts that Doodle is sickly + not normal - he may not live.

assertion

Even though Brother loved Doodle, he was often cruel to him.

The narrator explains what happened when he took Doodle to the barn and

~~"One day I took him up to the barn~~ left and showed him his casket, telling him how ^[we] all had believed he would die."

helps Doodle understand he is not winning because

Cruelty of Brother

what does this quote prove?

explanation

By forcing Doodle to view his own casket, even against his will, Brother ^{states} uses his authority + position to take advantage of his weaker brother.

narrator is harsh but honest
Doodle beat the odds

D. wants to please brother

Brother never got to tell Doodle
he loved him before he died, so his remorse
speaks clearly in the last scene
~~At the end of the story, the narrator~~
runs back to find Doodle, who is
lying face down dead and in disbelief
and Brother

~~"For a long time, it seemed forever, I lay there~~
crying, sheltering his fallen scarlet ibis from
the heresy of rain."
