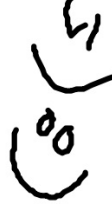
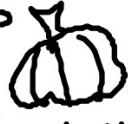

Journal Prompt:

What motto do you live by? Explain!

Details from Story "Powder" (Start of story)

Father "fights for the privilege" of the son's company - narrator (son) considers it being a privilege to spend time with him,; father and mother are separated.

Run-ons, Fragments and Complete sentences:

When you read a sentence, try reading it aloud. Where did you pause? Chances are that where you paused, you need some sort of punctuation.

Run-on sentences are when two or more independent sentences are joined together by no punctuation or by inadequate/inappropriate punctuation.

Fragments are sentences which a dependent clauses...they are basically incomplete thoughts and need something to be full, independent sentences.
