Ch. 1) "You

Ch. 2) "Say, what the hell's he got on his shoulder?" - George

- George is complaining about Curley, because Curley walked in and was mean to Lennie. George is talking about Curley's attitude, when he says "thing on his shoulder."

(Ch. 2) "Pants full of ants" - When you are irritated

Ch. 1) "They're poundin' their tail on some other ranch" the people are working hard, not actually pounding their tail

Ch. 2) "He's all a time picking scraps with big guys." Scrap = fights

Ch. 1) "Bus driver give us a bum steer" The bus driver left them at the wrong spot and so he "tricked" or made a mistake, to George and Lennie.

Ch. 1) "An' live off the fatta the land" - Lennie Lennie is telling George that in the future they can farm and survive from natural resources.

Ch 1) You get a ~~pick~~ pick outta that."

-This means that you would get something "partful" out of something.

Ch. 2 (~~Busting~~ busting 'em out) This means they are going to work hard.

(h2) "Giving them the eye." This means that Curley's wife likes to trick men and get them in trouble.

(h1) We're in hot water. We are in trouble.
