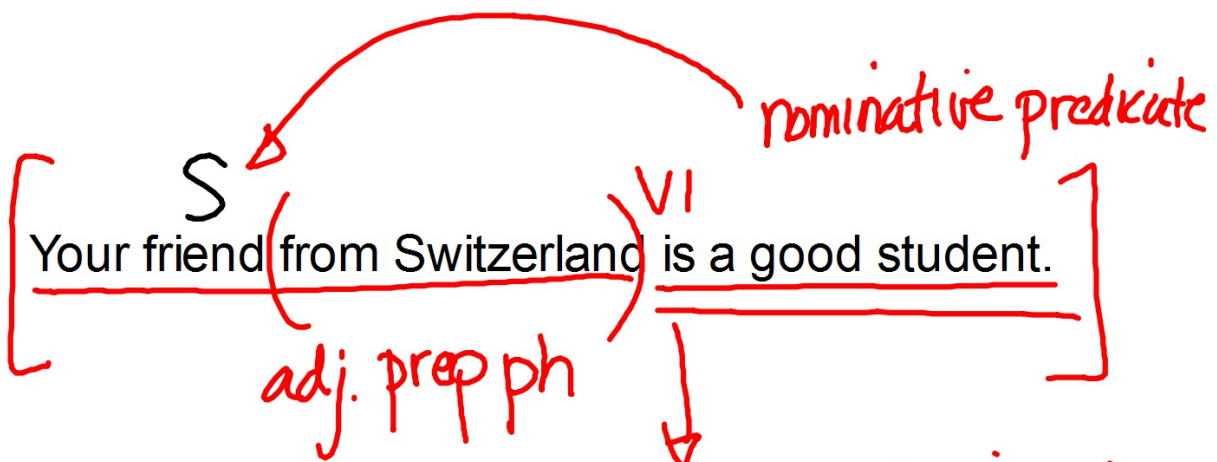

predicate nominative to be
refers to subject

renames the subject
& follows a linking verb

gun

George

Broken
Dreams

Crooks - crooked back; black "stable buck"
only "hand" who is literate!

Candy - sweet; missing hand
old

Lennie - large; mental
disability

excluded
for physical
characteristics

Slim - tall & thin, well respected by all

Curly hair
Curly - small; fighter/boxer
angry

carlson:
wants to kill dog (useless, smelly)
has gun

george told lenny to jump in the river
lenny did, and george saved him
turning point in the relationship

broken dreams as a theme

candy:
companionship with dog
(old, useless?)
sweet old man
wants to be included in g/l's
dream
missing a hand
excluded
swamper/janitor

curly's wife:
excluded because
she's a woman

g/l's dream:
hope, motivation

gets them through hard times

first time they talk about it-during the evening, on the river

like a bedtime story, calming routine

companionship

brothel:

george is invited, goes but doesn't want to spend \$
because of the dream-

this sets g/l apart

crooks:
crooked back
african-american
only literate character

curly:

small
