**Purpose**: To gain a deeper understanding of Shakespeare's times and Elizabethan theater; to further develop research techniques and proper citations; to practice narrative writing

**Product**: A journal of five entries written from the perspective of a citizen of London during Shakespeare's times.

## **Details**:

- You can be male or female, young or old; you should be of at least upper or middle class so that you would be capable of writing, with access to paper.
- You must have five different journal entries which discuss 4-5 of the following topics with some detail:
  - o Globe Theater/Elizabethan Theater
  - o Tournaments/Sports/Archery/The Hunt/Outdoor Recreation/Indoor Games/Spectator Events
  - o Clothing/Apparel
  - o Trade/Crafts & Trades/Agriculture/Occupations
  - o Food & Drink/Tableware/Family Life/Hearth and Home
  - o Around and About London/Historical Monuments/Sights in London
  - o Contact with a person other than yourself (your child, your servant, your sibling; a beggar or a vendor, etc.)
- You must have a Works Cited page and include at least five sources which are used in your journal. *Each source* will need to be annotated according to the attached form.
